AME MATTERS

CAUTION TO AMEs CONCERNING THE AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE ENGINEER – AVIATION TRAINING ORGANISATIONS (AME-ATOs) WHICH ARE NOT PART 141 OR 147 APPROVED

1. Any person who attends an Aviation Training Organisation that is not Part 141 or Part 147 approved, cannot use certificates for licensing purposes at the South African Civil Aviation Authority (SACAA) including South African Air Force Units (SAAF) that are not approved to conduct apprentice or Aircraft type training with SACAA, as the aforesaid certificates are invalid for licensing purposes.
2. For SACAA Part 141 approved AME-ATOs the instructors shall have an AME Licence with Instructor Rating for the course they are presenting and they shall appear in an updated approved AME-ATO Manual of Procedure.
