NOTICE OF APPROVAL OF EXTENSION OF GENERAL EXEMPTION FROM COMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF PART 64.02.2 and 64.02.3(1) and 64.02.4 OF THE CIVIL AVIATION TECHNICAL STANDARDS.

1. Purpose of this General Notice

This notice serves to communicate the extension of the general exemption against the provisions of Part 64.02.2 and 64.02.3(1.1) and 64.02.4 which provides for Training, Theoretical knowledge examination and Skill test for the issuance of a cabin crew member licence.

The SACAA has commenced with the amendment process of the affected regulatory provisions, but due to the extent of engagements required, the said regulatory amendments have not been finalised as yet. The Director of Civil Aviation has decided to extend the current general exemption, applicable to these Parts, while an amendment to the regulation is in progress.

The regulation amendment that is under development will ensure that the procedures applicable for the issuance and revalidation of a cabin crew member licence are clearly regulated and defined.

The general exemption is valid for a period of 180 (**one hundred and eighty**) days from date of signature of this general notice.

2. General

An exemption from strict compliance with the provisions of Part 64.02.2 and 64.02.3 (1.) and 64.02.4 is hereby granted by enabling continued application of existing and approved cabin crew training manuals, examinations and procedures for the issuance of a cabin crew licence.

The above exemption is subject to compliance with the following requirement:


- 2.1. All cabin crew training must still be approved by the SACAA;

- 2.2. All cabin crew students must still write and pass the examination at the Authority prior to undergoing the initial skills test with a designated cabin examiner; and
- 2.3. All cabin crew students must still submit proof of successfully completing the initial skills test prior to the issuance of the cabin crew licence. Training being conducted must still be approved by the SACAA.

This regulatory exemption will be valid for 180 days from date of signature of this general notice.

3. Decision by the Director of Civil Aviation

The SACAA reserves the right to amend the decisions contained in this notice should circumstances dictate the necessity thereof. Please note: If there are any regulatory changes this notice will be subject to review.
