

Some things were **NEVER** MEANT TO FLY!



Some seemingly harmless goods can be unsafe on board an aircraft due to variations in temperature and air pressure which can cause them to react dangerously, i.e., leak, ignite or explode.

For safety reasons, some dangerous goods may not be carried in baggage or as carry-on in the aircraft cabin.

The following items **CANNOT** be carried in checked baggage or into the aircraft cabin:

As a general rule, airline passengers cannot carry Dangerous Goods in checked baggage or into the aircraft cabin (carry-on baggage). The items shown here are just a partial list of forbidden Dangerous Goods that should not be carried by passengers.

EXPLOSIVES

Fireworks, Flares, toy caps



GASES

Compressed, flammable, or toxic gases including oxygen, butane, propane, refrigerant gases for cars, and pressurized scuba tanks. e.g., butane gas cylinders, tear gas, mace or pepper spray



FLAMMABLE MATERIALS AND LIQUIDS

Including fuels, lighter fluid, solvents, thinners, strike anywhere matches and some paints and adhesives. Any equipment that ever-contained fuel (e.g., camping stoves, chainsaws) must be completely purged of fuel residue and vapours. Most artist paints are non-flammable and permitted.



POISONS (TOXICS)

Including infectious substances; weed killers and insecticides



CORROSIVES AND OXIDIZERS

Including drain cleaners, paint strippers, pool chemicals, strong bleaches, mercury, alkalis, car batteries, and wet batteries.



The following items **CAN** be carried in checked baggage or into the aircraft cabin:

Airline passengers may carry small amounts of some dangerous goods for passengers comfort and personal use, subject to quantity/size limits and other restrictions.

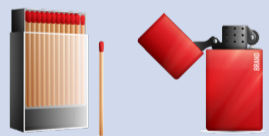
Some items, such as portable electronic devices powered by lithium batteries, spare lithium batteries and electronic cigarettes are allowed in the aircraft cabin (carry-on) but are forbidden in baggage – including sky-check bags checked at the gate or plane side.

Medicinal and toilet articles that are dangerous goods; including aerosols (if nozzles are protected), hairsprays, perfumes, nail polish and remover, alcohol-based hand sanitisers, inhalers, antiseptics, insect repellents, etc. No more than 0.5 kg/L per container and 2 kg/L total per person.



One book of matches or a lighter in carry-on or on your person (in your pocket).

Note: Spare lighter fluid, butane, strike-anywhere matches, and torch lighters are forbidden



Battery-powered wheelchairs and mobility devices when properly prepared. Contact your airline in advance for guidance.



Alcoholic beverages in unopened retail packaging, 70% alcohol by volume. No more than 5 litres per person.



Small arms ammunition securely boxed; in checked baggage only. Cartridges up to .75 calibre and all sizes of shotgun shells are permitted when properly declared. Not more than 5 kg gross mass per person.

Note: The carriage of firearms is subject to security protocols. Contact your airline for guidance.

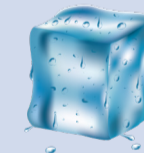


Portable electronic devices (laptops, cell phones, cameras, etc.) can be carried onboard subject to the requirements for lithium batteries. Spare batteries must be securely packed with the terminals protected.

Spare lithium batteries and electronic cigarettes are forbidden in checked baggage.



Dry ice in vented packages; up to (2.5 kgs) per passenger when used to pack perishables.



Other considerations

Airline passengers may carry small amounts of some dangerous goods for passengers comfort and personal use, subject to quantity/size limits and other restrictions.

HOVERBOARDS AND SIMILAR DEVICES CONTAINING LITHIUM BATTERIES

Many airlines have banned these items in both carry-on and checked baggage. Passengers who wish to travel with these vehicles should check with the airline concerned prior to travelling.



USE OF SMART BAGS

Developments of innovative baggage with integrated lithium batteries, commonly known as "smart luggage" are being marketed and sold to the traveling public. These devices include integrated lithium batteries, motors, power banks, GPS, GSM, Bluetooth, RFID or Wi-Fi technology. The presence of the lithium batteries can contravene various regulatory requirements. These devices require careful attention – even if permitted by the applicable regulations.

If you are using one of these bags, kindly declare it at check-in or contact your airline for guidance.
