Subject: This message is to advise you of FAA Airworthiness Directive (AD) 2020-16-01, effective August 19, 2020, which incorporated by reference European Union Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) AD 2020-0133, dated June 10, 2020, but also affects a part not included in the EASA AD.

Situation description: EASA AD 2020-0133 applies to all Airbus SAS Model A318, A319, A320, and A321 series airplanes. This AD was prompted by reports of low halon concentration in the forward and aft cargo compartments due to air leakage through cargo door seals. This condition, if not corrected, could affect the fire extinguishing system efficiency in the cargo compartments, possibly resulting in failure of the system to contain a cargo compartment fire. EASA AD 2020-0133 requires repetitive cleaning and greasing of forward and aft cargo door seals having Part Number (P/N) D523-71060-200-00, P/N D523-71060-202-00, or P/N D523-71060-204-00 (for A319, A320, and A321 airplanes); P/N D523-73001-200-00 or P/N D523-73001-202-00 (for A318 airplanes); and bulk cargo door seals having P/N D523-72002-200-00 or P/N D523-72002-202-00. FAA AD 2020-16-01 requires cleaning and greasing those part numbers but also includes forward and aft cargo door seal P/N D5237106020400S, approved under the FAA Part Manufacturer Approval (PMA) PQ1715CE. The EASA AD 2020-0133 does not address the seal P/N approved by the FAA PMA PQ1715CE.

Ongoing activities: If EASA issues an AD related to mandatory terminating action, the FAA may issue additional rulemaking.
