The pilot landed on Runway 12 upon arrival at the airstrip. During the landing roll, the pilot lost directional control, and the aircraft veered off to the left of the grass runway. The pilot tried to correct by applying the right rudder, but the aircraft continued to veer to the left. The aircraft eventually exited the runway. During the process, the nose wheel rolled over a trench which caused the aircraft to flip over. The pilot switched off the master after the occurrence.

The crash alarm was activated, and the Airport Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF) team responded to the accident site.

Upon arrival at the airstrip, the pilot observed the windsock which favoured Runway 34. During the landing roll, the undercarriage collapsed, and the propeller struck the ground. The aircraft skidded on its belly and came to rest on the runway.

Upon arrival at FARB, the SP was cleared to perform a touch-and-go landing on Runway 05. Before touchdown, the SP closed the throttle and pulled back the control yoke; the aircraft lost height and suddenly she felt a gust of wind pushing the aircraft up. She corrected by applying full power to execute a go-around. The aircraft landed hard on the nose wheel, consequently, the nose gear strut collapsed, and the propeller struck the ground. The aircraft came to a stop on the runway. The SP switched off the master switch and disembarked from the aircraft unassisted and unharmed. The aircraft sustained substantial damage. The crash alarm was activated, and the Airport Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF) team responded to the accident site and assisted in towing the aircraft to a hangar.

The flight from FATP was uneventful. However, approximately 10 kilometres from FAPE, the aircraft's engine stopped, prompting the pilot to conduct a forced landing on a public road at Algoa Park in the Eastern Cape province.

During the gear-up forced landing, the belly of the aircraft was damaged, but no injuries were reported.
