1.	Applicant 21 years or older	
2.	Valid Class 1 medical certificate issued in terms of Part 67	
3.	Hold a valid general certificate of proficiency in radiotelephony	
4.	Signed and completed relevant application form	
5.	Show evidence of holding a valid Student Pilot Licence or having held, within the previous 60 months, any of the following - a South African Private Pilot Licence (aeroplane); <b>OR</b> b a pilot licence (aeroplane) issued by a Contracting State	
6.	Hold a valid instrument Rating	
7.	Have successfully completed the training as prescribed in Document SA-CATS 61 at an approved Part 141 aviation training organisation. (The proof of having passed the examinations will act as proof of this aspect).	
8.	Logbook copies including career summary and endorsement of skills test by Instructor/DE on the logbook	
9.	Have passed the theoretical knowledge examination as prescribed in Document SA-CATS 61	
10.	Have undergone the skills test by a DFE 1, as referred to in regulation 61.07.4	
11.	A minimum of 1500 hours total flight time	
12.	A minimum of 500 hours PICUS <u>or</u> 250 hours PIC (Including a maximum of 150 hours PICUS)	
13.	A minimum of 200 hours cross country flight time (Including a maximum of 100 hours as co-pilot or PICUS)	
14.	A minimum of 75 hours instrument flight time (Including a maximum of 30 hours FSTD time)	
15.	Minimum of 100 hours PIC or co-pilot by night	
16.	Outcome of test to be marked on skills test	
17.	Sign next to all amendments and no tippex allowed	
18.	Skills test initial on each page by the DFE and applicant	
19.	Appropriately valid rated DFE checked	
20.	The appropriate fee as prescribed in Part 187	
21.	Show proof of English Language Proficiency in terms of CAR 61.01.7
