The SACAA has achieved ten (10) clean audits over 11 financial years and has also received six awards from the Auditor-General of South Africa for clean audit outcomes for good corporate governance.

He has served on various boards of state institutions such as the Perishable Export Control Board and has chaired a state-initiated commission. He served on various task teams aimed at developing government policy and has been appointed to serve on committees aimed at transforming and restructuring government departments and agencies.

As chairman of Mavone Consulting he has in his capacity advised and consulted for companies such as Bouygues (France, Transport sector), Shaft Sinkers (Mining Sector), and various state institutions in areas ranging from business rescue to compliance and transformation. He has published two books: Beautiful Fools and Studying under the barrel of a gun. The former laments the deficiency of leadership in Africa and the latter is an autobiography detailing the role of student leadership in resisting Apartheid in the 1980s.

Mkhuleko Hlengwa (born 12 June 1987) served as the Chairperson of Parliament's Standing Committee on Public Accounts (SCOPA). He became a Member of the National Assembly in February 2012 and has served on the SCOPA committee since 2014. Hlengwa was previously the National Chairperson of the IFP Youth Brigade.

Hlengwa was born in Durban. His father, Mhlabunzima Hlengwa, served as an IFP MP from 1994 until 2004. He became a party activist at age 10 in 1997 and soon became National Chairperson of the IFP Youth Brigade.

He was sworn in as a Member of the National Assembly in May 2012 and consequently became one of the youngest parliamentarians.

Following his re-election in May 2014, Hlengwa became a member of the Standing Committee on Public Accounts.

In June 2019, the African National Congress offered the SCOPA chairpersonship to the IFP. The party accepted and nominated Hlengwa to head the committee. He took office in July 2019. Mthokozisi Nxumalo succeeded him as National Chairperson of the IFP Youth Brigade.[7][8][9]

Hlengwa was re-elected to the National Assembly at the 2024 general election, having been ranked third on the IFP national list. He currently serves as Deputy Minister of Transport.



Ms Thilly De Bodt
